3	☐ Unsettled, crying, groaning☐ Biting/chewing painful area☐ Guards/protects painful area☐ May be unwilling to move	Reaction may be subtle if too painful to move/stoicMay be dramatic: sharp cry/growl/bite	Moderate Reassess analgesic pain
4	 Constantly groaning/screaming May bite/chew at painful area but unlikely to move Potentially unresponsive Difficult to distract from pain 	☐ Cries at palpation☐ Reacts aggressively	Moderate to Severe May be rigid Reassess analgesic pain
