## RESULTS: TOTAL SCORE ADDED FROM EACH SECTION

- 0-8: Quality of life is most likely adequate. No medical intervention is required at this time. Guidance from your veterinarian may help identify signs to look for in the future.
- 9-16: Quality of life is questionable and medical intervention is suggested. Your pet would likely benefit from veterinary oversight and guidance to evaluate disease process
- 17-32: Quality of life is compromised. Changes are likely to become more progressive and more severe. Veterinary guidance will help you understand the end stages of your pet's disease process in order to make a better decision on continuing hospice care or electing peaceful euthanasia.
